I chose RTI because it was biblically-based education, but also because it had a high focus on practical hands-on ministry skills. I wanted a school that was going to teach me how to take my knowledge into the real world, and RTI did just that.

My Project Management class gave me the tools to know how to submit a proper project proposal. Preaching and teaching



helped me to effectively communicate a biblically based sermon. Our theology courses prepared me to pass my licensing and ordination exams, but more importantly gave me a secure foundation for my beliefs. Emotionally Healthy Leadership and Peacemaking equipped me to be a leader who knows how to identify my own issues and handle conflict in a God-honoring way.

In addition to the personal transformation RTI provided, the reality that RTI helped me graduate debt-free was one of the greatest gifts I have received. My "yes" to God's call couldn't have been as assured without the financial freedom provided through RTI. When God called me to move to New York to attend Alliance Theological Seminary, I had to face the reality of the financial aspects of living in the city and obtaining a Master's. However, having finished RTI debt-free I knew I was in a place where I was able to drop everything and go.

CAMERON WEST Class of 2019, Currently serving in Cambodia

I've learned to be persistent in achieving my goals, whether it has been going through the process of Alliance Apprenticeship, understanding a Biblical/theological doctrine, learning a language or learning to thrive in a new culture. The RTI faculty always encouraged us to lean in to the subject matter and ask hard questions so that greater understanding for everyone could be found.

Being in the second cohort, the way classes or assignments were done could sometimes change frequently, as some of the curriculum was still being figured out. While it was certainly stressful at times, it has also



helped me learn how to work effectively and have a good attitude when things do not go according to plan, which is just about every day in Cambodia. In fact, one of the first things my field director in Cambodia told me was "Do not be surprised if you have to go all the way to plan D to get something accomplished."

Spiritual disciplines have been incredibly important as I have been starting my missions journey in Cambodia. Nearly all of my deeper community is on a different continent than me, and the language spoken most often here is still a barrier to me. This has led me to have an increased reliance on God and make sure to set aside time to be with him and meditate on his Word. I can safely say that had I not learned, practiced and had spiritual disciplines modeled for me at RTI, I probably would not be able to cope or do ministry in a healthy manner here.
